Daily classes and workshops are held in a custom-designed, air-conditioned arts complex with dance studios, digital media and music/audio production labs, skylit art studios, practice rooms and a fully-equipped professional theatre. Choose the major you want, take master classes in clowning, stage combat, self-defense and trips to Broadway shows.

There will be chances to perform in departmental workshops—and in a major performance at the end of the “season.”

Who it's for: Students from sixth grade up with an interest in the arts. There are classes for those who already have a lot of training—and other classes for those beginning their first experience.

HOW TO APPLY: Ask your school guidance counselor or principal for an application. After acceptance—which requires the recommendation of your school district—you will be placed in classes based upon age and level of achievement.
